

Tuition Fee Charging and Refunding Policy 2017/18

Further to DMU's enrolment processes (whether onlinewia paper form), under the terms and conditions of enrolment, all students agree to the following:

- x Liability for all tuition fees incurred over the duration of their programme of study, in whole or in part, and that if the student or their sponsor fadspay their tuition fees in a timely manner that DMU reserves the right to terminate the student's studies.
- x Understanding that DMU reserves the right to take legal action against the student in order to recover any debt.
- x Understanding that should a studewish to leave DMU before the end of their programme of study, the student is responsible for contacting the University to terminate (or interrupt) their enrolment and that the student is liable to incur costs equating to up to a full year of tuition feetheir registration is terminated by DMU on behalf of the student.
- x Requests to interrupt or withdraw enrolment are not confirmed until the university has approved the request; the date of interruption or withdrawal used for charging and refund purposes Wibe the date that the university has confirmed the request.




Tuition fee liability-NHS courses

The government has changed the way students studying nursing, midwifery and speech and language therapy courses are funded.

2. For all students attending university from September 2017 onwards NHS bursaries will no longer beavailable. Instead, you will have access to the standard student support package of tuition fee loans and support for living costs from Student Finance England. Students studying an NMC accredited course (previously NHS commissioned programmes) beginning September 2017 and March 2018 will have access to the standard student support package of tuition fee loans and support for living costs. 
- 3. After Monday 16 October 2017, once a term has started, you are liable for the full fee for that term, even if you withdraw or interrupt your course during the term.


